Part II - Professional qualifications

An appropriate method must be applied when setting priorities. For the first CESNI work programme, the Secretariat proposes applying the method developed for the service provision agreement between the European Commission and the CCNR to ensure that the work timetable and financing are aligned. The above-mentioned method envisages the following priorities:

Priority I to be finalised in the first half of the 3-year mandate

Priority II to be finalised in the second half of the 3-year mandate

Priority III evaluation to be finished in the 3-year mandate
Priority IV standardisation work to start in the 3-year mandate.

Permanent means that the particular action is to be performed continuously. The action in question has no start or endpoint.

Resolution CESNI 2018-I-2

Creation of the temporary working group on technical requirements for passenger vessels (CESNI/PT/Pax)

The European Committee for drawing up standards in the field of inland navigation (CESNI),

with reference to article 8 of its Rules of Procedure,

recalling its Internal Regulations on working groups,

at the request of the permanent Working Group on technical requirements (CESNI/PT) resolves to set up the temporary working group on technical requirements for passenger vessels (CESNI/PT/Pax).

The mission of this temporary working group is defined in the annex.

This Resolution shall enter into force immediately.

Mission of the temporary working group on technical requirements for passenger vessels (CESNI/PT/Pax)

1. Mission

The Working Group CESNI/PT noted that implementation of certain provisions of Chapter 19 of the ES-TRIN is problematic for the Inspection Bodies as well as for the industry that is in charge of its application. It acknowledges its responsibility for improving the wording or interpretation of the concerned technical requirements in this chapter.

As part of the work programme (task CESNI-2016-2), the main tasks of the temporary working group on technical requirements for passenger vessels (CESNI/PT/Pax) consist of:

- examination of the difficulties encountered in implementing certain provisions of Chapter 19 of the ES-TRIN, mainly based on documents CESNI/PT (16) 55 rev. 1 and CESNI/PT (17) 15 corr. 1:
- drawing conclusions on solutions to these difficulties;
- where necessary, proposing concrete amendments to individual requirements or Administrative Instructions as well as for additions to the database on the interpretations.

The work is not intended to formulate any new substantive requirements, but does not exclude that some requirements could be modified, rearranged or clarified. In this context, the temporary working group is also required to prepare an impact assessment, in particular as regards financial, administrative and social costs.

The principal mission of the temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax shall be carried out under the supervision of the permanent CESNI/PT Working Group.

2. Composition

The composition of the temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax shall be as follows:

3. Work scheduling

The temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax starts examining the list of difficulties over a 4 months period beginning in September 2018. This period is extended by two years if the task is maintained in the working programme for 2019-2021.

4. Number and frequency of meetings

Two meetings lasting no more than two days are planned for 2018. If the task is maintained in the working programme 2019-2021, a total of 6 meetings lasting no more than two days are planned over a three year period (2018-2020) for the temporary working group to carry out its mission. The temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax will decide on a meeting schedule at its first meeting following the entry into force of this resolution and then at the beginning of each year. The temporary working group may not increase the number and frequency of meetings.

5. Reports by the Chair of the temporary working group

In accordance with article 3 (4) of the Internal Regulations on working groups, the Chair of the working group shall provide regular reports to the permanent working group CESNI/PT on its work.

6. Support by the Secretariat

Mr Benjamin Boyer, in his capacity as Administrator with responsibility for technical requirements shall support the work of the temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax by:

- convening the meetings and drafting the minutes of the decisions made during the meetings;
- helping to draw up proposals for submission to the permanent working group CESNI/PT and to helping to produce summary documents.

7. Working language

In accordance with Article 2 (2) (e) of the Internal Regulations on working groups, the temporary working group CESNI/PT/Pax shall work in English. The basic documents will be circulated in the four working languages. The meetings could be held in the four languages if necessary, and this shall be accepted by the Chair of the Committee and the financial aspect taken into consideration.
